Magnetic Map

LOCATING LOCAL LAND AND WATER FORMS

Materials needed:

- · magnetic board
- local map—printed to same size as magnetic board
- tape
- labels of land and water form names printed on card stock
- · magnetic tape
- · scissors

Preparation:

- Find a map of your local area online. Look for simple land and water forms without labels. Print out to same size as magnetic board. Tape to magnetic board.
- 2. Print out labels for: lake, island, bay, cape, isthmus, straight, system of lakes, archipelago, gulf, peninsula, and other names relevant to your specific area, like city names, ocean, and so forth.
- 3. Cut out labels and adhere pieces of magnetic tape to the back.

Directions:

- 1. Read your class *Water Land: Land and Water Forms Around the World* by Christy Hale. Study
 the definitions page in the back.
- 2. Open up the fold-out world map and invite students to point out the different land and water forms discussed in the book.
- 3. Show students the magnetic board of your local area. See if students can identify your city on the map. Position a magnetic label there. Invite a volunteer to look for a lake and position a magnetic label there. Ask for another volunteer to position a label where there is an island, and so forth, until all the relevant labels have been positioned on the magnetic map board.
